## Abstract

This study examined cooperative association as a strategy for rural development and property reduction in Rwanda. Case study of cooperative Abahuzamugambi ba Kawa based in Maraba sector, Huye District in southern province. The sample population comprises the members, management, and Board of the Abahuzamugambi ba kawa. The research questionnaire was used to gather data from members, management and the populace. The research questions focused on the principles of cooperative identity, participation and decision making, internal and external communications, organisational and leadership development, the relationship between the cooperative's leadership, the initiatives of people to lift themselves out of poverty, the knowledge would support poor people own development.
